DECEMBER 24TH

NOON: Holiday Choral Festival 2013 – An encore broadcast of the 2013 Holiday Choral Festival, featuring the American Spiritual Ensemble, Louisville Chamber Choir, University of Louisville Cardinal Singers and the Louisville Youth Choir.

2PM: A Chanticleer Christmas – A one-hour celebration from the 12-voice Chanticleer men's choir. The program features music from England in the 1300s to contemporary carols.

4PM: An Anonymous 4 Christmas – Anonymous 4 sings medieval music from England, France and Spain that praises the Virgin Mary. The devotional songs come from the Codex Las Huelgas, Montpellier Codex, and Cantigas de Santa Maria.

2PM: St. Olaf Christmas Festival – Hymns, carols, choral works, and orchestral selections featuring the five choirs and Orchestra of St. Olaf College.

8PM: And Glory Shone Around: An Early-American Christmas with the Rose Ensemble – The Rose Ensemble presents a unique special, drawing from 19th-century songbooks, featuring carols of the New England colonies, Appalachian folk tunes, Shaker spiritual songs and more.

10PM: Light and Gold: The Music of Eric Whitacre – Eric Whitacre introduces his music and describes the often-colorful backstory of how each piece came to be.
